10. The Chinese first came here in 1900, working in the old harbour. It's a mark of Dutch long-standing tolerance to drugs that the government of the time allowed the Chinese to smoke opium, the justification being that it was part of their culture.

11. Americans also love cooking. And they don't always make simple things. Some of them are real gourmets, and they enjoy preparing fine meals. They spend thousands of dollars each year on cook-books and cooking utensils to use in their kitchens. Like people in many countries, people in the US love entertainment, so they often invite people to dinner.

12. In 1770, the Boston Massacre occurred in which British soldiers shot and killed 5 American demonstrators on the Boston Common. In 1773, to protest a new set of taxes on tea, a group of Americans dressed up like Indians, climbed aboard a ship full of tea and threw it all overboard into Boston Harbor. This was known as the Boston Tea Party.

13. People have been using the word 'dinosaur' now 150 years. Before 1841, people knew about these enormous animals of the past from the bones they found. But no one had a name for them. Then in 1841, Richard Qwen gave them the name we know now. He used the Greek words deinos — terrible, and sauros — lizard, and joined them to make the new word.
